



Professor Carsten Maple

Carsten Maple obtained his BSc (Hons) Mathematics at the University of Leicester in 1994 and went on to receive his PhD in 1998. He joined the University of Luton in 1998 as a Lecturer in Computer Science before moving into Senior Lecturer role later the same year and a Principal Lecturer post by 2002. In 2004 he was appointed Professor of Applicable Computing and was promoted to Head of the Department for Computer Science and Technology at the newly formed University of Bedfordshire where he led the Department before his promotion to Pro-Vice Chancellor for Research and Enterprise in 2010.

Carsten's research interests include Network and Computer Security, Distributed Systems and Cyberstalking. He is a certified ethical hacker.

He has published over 150 peer reviewed papers and is the author of the UK Security Breaches report supported by the Serious Organised Crime Agency and the Police Central e-crime Unit.

Carsten is a Fellow of the British Computer Society, the Chartered Institute for IT, a member of BCS Security Community of Expertise and is a Chartered IT professional.

He has recently worked with the Association of Chief Police Officers, the Crown Prosecution Service, the Ministry of Justice and the Information Assurance Advisory Council

Carsten holds two Professorships in China, including a position at one of the top two control engineering departments in China.
